Message from the president:



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I would like to send my deepest condolences to all the people who lost their lives because of The Great East Japan Earthquake, Typhoons, and Heavy precipitation. I would also like to express my sympathy to the sufferers from the natural disasters and to pay my respect to workers who risk their lives to restore the nuclear power plant in Fukushima which has not been settled yet.
